CLASS 37
CARROT AND PINEAPPLE CAKE
8" deep cake tin

- 200g (7oz) self-raising flour
- 300g (11oz) granulated sugar
- 1½ tsp ground cinnamon
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 175ml (6fl oz) sunflower oil
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 100g (3½ oz) raw carrots grated
- 100g (3½ oz) chopped walnuts/flaked almonds
- 60g (2 oz) desiccated coconut (optional)
- 220g can pineapple slices, drained, chopped and dried thoroughly

For The Icing:

- 250g (9 oz) tub mascarpone cheese
- 2-3 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tblsp icing sugar, sifted
- About 25g (1oz) chopped walnut pieces/flaked almonds
